How Do I Adopt a Quilt?

- Remove envelope and safety pin from the quilt of your choice
- Place your \$3.00 (or more) in envelope and seal
- Place envelope in basket at back of sanctuary
- Make checks payable to OSLC (“quilts” on memo line)

How You Can Help...

- Adopt a quilt (or 2 or 3..)
- Help roll quilts after church today
- Donate fabric/embroidery floss
- Donate \$ for batting (costs \$6.00 per quilt)
- Sew quilt kits
- Sew backings from large pieces of fabric

Our Volunteers...

- Cut donated fabric into squares
- Lay out quilt top kits
- Sew together quilt tops from kits
- Piece large pieces of fabric into backings
- Tie quilt layers on “sandwich” days
- Sew binding around quilt edges

Did You Know?

- All of our fabric is donated by members and friends of OSLC
- We can use clean, gently-used light blankets and mattress pads to fill quilts
- Gently-used, clean sheets and table cloths can be used for backings
- It takes ~ 4 skeins of embroidery floss to tie a quilt; that’s about 650 skeins each year at \$2.00 each
- We include bar codes in each box of quilts to track it destination (some 2022 quilts went to Ukraine for example)
- Batting to fill 28 quilts costs \$170
